

Speaker - Dr. Paul L. Maier

Dr. Paul Luther Maier is Professor of Ancient History (em.) at Western Michigan University, a four-term Vice President of the Lutheran Church-- Missouri Synod, and a much-published author

of both scholarly and popular works. He was was born in St. Louis, MO, and is the son of Lutheran Hour founder, Walter A. Maier.

In 1958 he was ordained into the ministry as campus chaplain to Lutheran students at Western Michigan University in Kalamazoo, MI. Two years later, he was invited onto the History faculty at Western,



where he taught and researched for the next 50 years.

In his writings he originated two new literary genres: the documentary historical novel, and the theological thriller. His novels include two historical documentaries: *Pontius Pilate* and *The Flames of Rome*, as well as a theological thriller that became # 1 national bestseller in religious fiction in 1994, *A Skeleton in God's Closet*. The sequels, *More Than a Skeleton* and *The Constantine Codex* completed the trilogy. His non-fiction works include *In the Fullness of Time*, *Josephus – The Essential Works*, and Eusebius -- The Church History. Maier's latest work is a new edition/commentary on Foxe's Book of Martyrs, of the Reformation Era. About four million Maier books are now in print, many translated into twenty languages, as well as over 250 scholarly articles and reviews in professional journals.

He married his wife, Joan in 1967, and they have four daughters: Laura, Julie, Krista and Katie, all of whom live in southwestern Michigan.

His books and tapes are available to purchase at his table in the hallway.

Council of Lutheran Women President's Report - 2019

The Council of Lutheran Women celebrated its 55th anniversary at the annual Council of Lutheran Women Luncheon in March. At the luncheon 48 women from member organizations were honored as their Women of the Year. The speaker following lunch was Gayle Sommerfeld, co-founder of Mission Opportunities Short Term (MOST Ministries) and author of "Beyond Sight", the story behind the founding of this ministry. The proceeds of the luncheon along with generous support from Church Extension Fund, Thrivent and other organizations and individuals made it possible to award scholarships to 14 seminarian students including one deaconess student and two young women preparing for professional church work careers at Concordia University-Ann Arbor.

The Council continues to support several mission projects. Each year layettes are prepared and given to organizations that serve mothers in need of assistance. Over \$860 was shared with Detroit Lutheran Food Banks, along with contributions of food and paper products, personal hygiene items, clothing and many other items needed by several of our inter-congregational members of the Council such as Camp Restore Detroit, Family of God, Gifts for All God's Children, MOST, and Poblo. The Council website has been focusing on these inter-congregational groups and their needs to keep our membership better informed on how we can support these groups.

The Executive Committee and the Board of Directors met five times during the year to plan the activities of the Council. The Council thanks the hosting congregations in 2019: Emmanuel, Dearborn; St. Matthew, Westland; Mt. Calvary, Detroit; St. Peter, Macomb; Huntington Woods Lutheran and Holy Cross, Warren.

The Council faces new challenges as congregations close or merge, resulting in fluctuations in our membership. We continue to welcome new organizations into the Council as well as new avenues for funding. Our first year as a recipient of Thrivent Choice Dollars has resulted in \$491 to date. We continue to offer a Sponsorship Program for anyone wishing to contribute towards the funds for scholarships. The Council is thankful to our Lord for all the women who serve in our churches, homes, and communities. With gratitude to our Lord for His bountiful blessings, we pray for His continued guidance of our efforts.
