Food Banks of Metro-Detroit: Ivy Thompson

Food banks are a non-profit charitable organization that distributes food to those who have difficulty purchasing enough to avoid hunger. Some food banks operate on the front line model giving out food directly to the hungry. Others operate on the warehouse model, supplying food to intermediaries like food pantries, soup kitchens and other front line organizations.

The world's first food bank was established in the US in 1967 but at <u>Peace Lutheran</u>, it began in the late 1980's and early 1990's. <u>St. John Lutheran</u> food bank began in 2009. At Peace, the outreach grew and is still growing.

<u>Peace Lutheran Detroit Food Pantry</u> continues to serve the neighborhood around Peace Church faithfully every Tuesday at 11 o'clock. We are blessed to have you continue to partner with our food ministry over the many years. Your support is needed and greatly appreciated. We serve 45 families each week. We have one gentleman, Tony, who is regularly at the pantry. He stopped in two weeks ago to donate \$10.00 and said he is so thankful that we are here because it is the source of his food for the week. We have received 30 to 40 pizzas each week from Pizza Hut, the last three months. This has been a great addition to our giveaway each week. Continue to remember us in your prayers. We are so thankful for your kindness and generosity.

Report to the CLW General Meeting –September 27, 2021 Human Care Committee Mission Support Coordinator: Barbara Hoffmeier

We have had eight planning committee meetings for the MISSION FOCUS event on September 27, 2021 over the last two years. I thank the committee members who worked with me: Barb Collins, Sandy Hardies, Willie Marie Henry, Patti Jacques, Candie Sionkowski, and Lucie Witte. *This has been a long process, but we have trusted in God's plan to bring it all together. May HE be glorified in all our work.* The MISSION FOCUS is designed to familiarize our attendees with opportunities to volunteer and support local ministries.

We planned for 200 registrants with 100+ being registered by the deadline the week before the event. The total was _____ (t.b.d.) Registrations were on Eventbrite beginning August 1st. There was no cost for registration. Donations were accepted on Eventbrite for Mission Partners and divided between the ten presenters. Candi S. did an excellent job keeping us informed with registrations.

Two Thrivent Action Cards were used for meals. Donations were accepted for lunch with baskets put out by the Treasurer. Sheri Comeford and her husband catered the event that included a simple snack breakfast bar and a boxed lunch. Judy Shepherd and Laura Thomas provided excellent publicity pieces on various media.

Faith Lutheran Troy provided the facility and coffee bar, the staff was very helpful with setting things up and providing tables, chairs, the sound system, and a technician to operate the PowerPoint program. Kendra Corman volunteered her time and talents with collating the PowerPoints. The Michigan District LCMS provided the programs that we put together and did the printing for us. Five Hostesses were put throughout the building for welcoming and to direct people to the Chapel area. Three men were asked to attend the parking lots in the morning.

Letters were sent via Constant Contact to 10 Presenters and 11 Exhibitors with information for their submissions for the booklet and Power Point presentations. Follow-up phone calls and emails were continuous to get everything within the time frame set. The <u>Presenters</u> were (members of the CLW and considered our "mission partners'): Camp Restore Detroit, Elli's House, Family of God, Gifts For All God's Children, Lutheran Heritage Foundation, Lutheran Special Education Ministries, MOST Ministries, POBLO, The Luke Clinic, and Wellspring Lutheran Services. The <u>Exhibitors</u> were: CLW Activities and Scholarship Program, CLW Food Banks, CLW Operation Layette, Ephaphatha Mission Society, Faith Lutheran Church, Lutheran High School Association, LWML English District, LWML Michigan District, the Michigan District LCMS, and Thrivent Financial. We hope to have the program recorded and available on the CLW website for individual groups to use as their own Mission Focus.
