and served internships in inner-city St. Louis before returning to her home state. In her role, she partners with Detroit Lutheran churches to teach discipleship to

Her education at Concordia taught her to work alongside pastors and lay leaders to incorporate meaningful ways of engaging families in the life of the local and broader Church. Megan grew up at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Royal Oak and attended Lutheran High School Northwest.

Thirty-eight 2022 Woman of the Year honorees were recognized on stage and all 2020 and 2021 honorees were recognized on screen and asked to stand for in-person recognition. CLW Historian Pat Schultz introduced each Woman of the Year and highlighted activities of the honorees in their churches and communities.

Speaker Rev. Dr. Gregory Seltz, Executive Director of Lutheran Center for Religious Liberty (LCRL), shared insight into his work to keep Christ in the minds and hearts of elected and other officials in Washington, D.C. He also speaks to Lutheran groups on a regular basis to teach and inform about Christian citizenship.
