quote sums up the philosophy of former Lutheran Women's Missionary League President Ida Mall, who served from

1991-1995 and continues to serve and mentor the women of the LWML. She looks "to actively seek opportunities to

share my faith in Jesus with others" and makes that focus her personal mission.

Mall was a local president, zone president, and LWML Louisiana-Mississippi District President, 1972-1976. She also served as ILWML Public Relations Director and Planner before being elected president in 1991.

She served on the LCMS Board for Congregational Services, LCMS Board for Missions, and the LCMS Outreach Task Force, Lutheran Braille Workers, Inc. Board, and several positions in the LCMS Southern District. She has been married to her husband, Ken, for over 61 years. They have two children and six grandchildren.

To enter Burton Manor: Those using the cross-over from WB Schoolcraft (just beyond the Inkster exit from I-96 if coming from the east) must remember to watch for the oncoming traffic from EB Schoolcraft before entering the driveway.

Parking: Park either to the right or continue behind the hall (south side). Attendees can enter via the south side or west side entrances. The South Lobby Door is best for anyone using a cane or walker.

Large Quantity Donation Drop-off: Proceed to the doorway with the SUITE 8 sign to the right of the South Lobby Door. Students will be posted at all doorways to assist with unloading and carrying donations to the Ingathering Room (Suite 8).
