





Due to the ongoing restrictions and precautions of COVID-19, the annual luncheon moved to a webinar format for the Council's 57th anniversary celebration. The event included live and recorded components during the 1 hour event. Virtual Mistress of Ceremonies, Laura Thomas, glued together each segment with introductions and remarks. The event included taped greetings from three Women of the Year honorees, three scholarship recipients, and a virtual tribute to the 57 Women of the Year honorees for 2020 and 2021.
