Sharing the Gospel with Michigan's Deaf Community

Rev. Thomas Dunseth and Deaconess Diana Rice work with a very special student body in Dearborn. St. Martin School for the Deaf shares space with Emmanuel Lutheran School and offers an exceptional Christ-centered Classical Education designed with the needs of deaf students in mind. The curriculum is designed specifically to meet emotional and social needs of deaf and hard of hearing students through classroom instruction in American Sign Language and literacy in English.



Deaconess Diana Rice majored in Elementary Education at the University of Macau, China and studied American Sign Language and English as a Second Language at Gallaudet University.

She is deaf and has a unique relationship and bond with the students as the head teacher at St. Martin.

Rev. Dunseth graduated from Concordia Theological Seminary in 1993 and first served the LCMS Board for Mission Services as a missionary to St. Paul Lutheran School for the Deaf in the Portuguese colony of Macau. Returning to

the Michigan District in 2001, he served at Our Savior Lutheran Church of the Deaf congregation and is presently called

Twice per year, a handful of volunteers gather to assemble layettes at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Royal Oak. Ingatherings, cash donations and knitters provide items needed for CLW's **Operation Layette**. Last spring 20 layettes were given to Image Clear Ultrasound and the Luke Clinic to support mothers who choose life for their babies. The next assembly will be at St. Paul this fall.

Two tenacious ladies in Detroit keep the doors open at Peace Lutheran Detroit Food Pantry and St. John Evangelical Lutheran Church Food Bank. CLW provides assistance through ingatherings and cash donations that help a combined total of 90 families at both sites.

Pastoral and deaconess seminarians are eligible for scholarship assistance as a benefit of their congregations' CLW membership. The Council also sponsors two memorial scholarships at Concordia University Ann Arbor for female church work students. Both are funded by proceeds from the Annual Luncheon and cash donations.
