  unemployed, working poor, elderly and challenged members of the St. John community.
- St. John Food Bank serves an average of 50 families per distribution. Our number fluctuates based on the Headstart's school sessions and weather conditions on the day of distribution.
- We provide recipients with healthy meal choices such as non-perishable goods, meat, fresh vegetables, fruits, breakfast items, and a variety of snacks. Personal hygiene and care items are also provided when available. We provide emergency food for those in need and also for those who are not able to pick up on the pre-scheduled distribution days.
- Our food bank, as a critical needs organization for the state of Michigan, has adopted safety protocols
  and is working with community partners to prevent the exposure of COVID during our food distributions
  and all other operations.
