The Organization

An auxiliary of the Lutheran Center Association (LCA), founded in 1964 through the efforts of Lutheran Center director Rev. Kenneth Lindsay and a group of interested LCMS women, the Council is a federation of Detroit metropolitan area Lutheran Women's organizations. Members share vital concerns and combine their efforts to exert on these concerns a strong Christian witness in word and in deed.

Objectives

1. To unite the efforts of the member women's organizations of the LCMS under a coordinated program.
2. To encourage better understanding of the objectives of member organizations.
3. To invite closer cooperation and participation in services and activities of member organizations.
4. To offer educational programs of benefit to women's organizations.
5. To cooperate with community groups as approved by the Council.
6. To offer support as an auxiliary of the Lutheran Center Association of Southwest Michigan.

Annual Luncheon

The Council of Lutheran Women holds its Annual Luncheon on the third Tuesday of March. The purpose of the luncheon is two-fold.

First, the Council honors the Lutheran Woman of the Year nominated by each member organization.

Second, the proceeds from the luncheon supports seminary and deaconess students from member organizations and two memorial scholarships for young women preparing for full-time church work through Concordia University-Ann Arbor.

The luncheon begins by honoring all the Women of the Year followed by a delicious meal. Following lunch the group is inspired and entertained by a well-known speaker or special entertainment. The luncheon concludes with prayer and song.

Reservations for the luncheon are accepted beginning in early January for that year's luncheon.

Membership

Membership in the Council of Lutheran Women (CLW) is open to:

- Women's organizations within the Missouri Synod congregations (Ladies Aid, Altar Guild, LWML, Women's Ministries, etc.) of Southeast Michigan
- Inter-congregational organizations (LWML Zones, Lutheran High School volunteer groups, etc.)
- Individual members of LCMS congregations having no organization affiliated with the CLW (no more than two individuals per congregation)

Annual Membership dues are \$30 for groups and \$25 for individuals due November 1st for the following year.
